ADVANCED PLACEMENT



Advanced Placement (AP) is a program in the United States and Canada created by the College Board which offers college-level curricula and examinations to high school students. American colleges and universities may grant **placement** and course credit to students who obtain high scores on the examinations.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE



The **International Baccalaureate® (IB)** offers four high quality international education programmes to more than one million students in more than 146 countries.

DUAL AND CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT



Concurrent enrollment (CE) differs from other models of dual **enrollment** because high school instructors teach the college courses. It is sometimes called “dual credit,” “dual **enrollment**,” “college in the high school,” “middle college,” or “early college.”

Dual enrollment (DE) programs allow students to be **enrolled** in two separate, academically related institutions. Generally, it refers to high school students taking college or university courses. Less commonly, it may refer to any individual who is participating in two related programs.
