- Purposeful Collaboration between CEP offices, Admission offices and High School Guidance Counseling offices

Weber State University



- Serve 9,258 students annually in the CEP
- Primary Service Area is 17 High Schools
 - Largest high school=1000 unique students taking CE classes
 - Smallest high school=196 unique students taking CE classes
- Offer 85 different classes
- 42 total high schools
- 420 teachers have applied for 17-18 school year
- Legislatively drive and financed at \$5 credit tuition

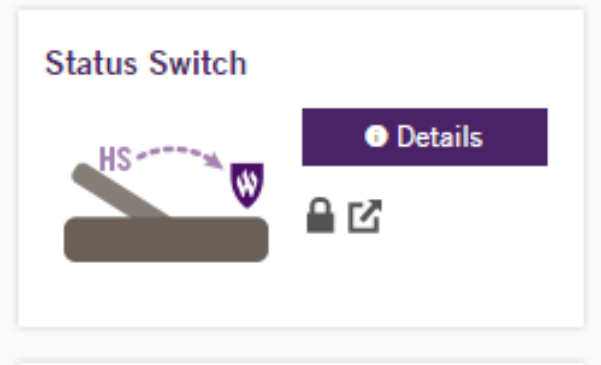

How do we switch status without a new application?



Create a 2nd SGASTN Record in Banner



- **College Application Week**
 - WSU Recruiter's/CEP Academic Advisers are out in high schools assisting with the switch

- **Students Click on the Icon in their eWeber Portal to answer two questions from the drop down selection**
 - When do they plan to start at Weber State University?
 - What degree to they plan to pursue?

What does this do for the student?



- Unlocks the door for Financial Aid and Scholarships
- All concurrent enrollment students are eligible for New Freshman Academic Scholarships
- Can begin to submit FAFSA applications

Collection of Transcripts in November



- Electronic Transcripts of every senior from all of our feeder high schools are sent by November 30.
 - This includes the October ACT scores
- Admissions office attaches HS transcripts to student record by January 12 scholarship deadline and all concurrent enrollment students are in the pool for academic scholarships

Concerns with the 2nd SGASTN Record?



- It isn't active until April 4 when Summer and Fall registration begins.
- There are no conflicts of a Spring semester Concurrent Enrollment registration.

What did this do for us?



- Opened the doors of the high schools for more student interaction
- Annual Lunch Visits with all the counselors
- All in the name of CE
 - After all-they are college students earning college credits

Academic Advising Appointments



- Not perfect yet, but it's getting better and better each year.
- Who is the target student?
 - 9 credits hours
 - Concurrent Enrollment Edge Scholarship
- What does it look like?
 - One-on-one appointments
 - Kids are summoned to the office for 10-15 minute visits

Wait what? CE Edge Scholarship



- WSU looks at Concurrent Enrollment as a recruitment effort
- Built an academic scholarship just for CE students
- 12 WSU CE Credits
- 3.0 College GPA
- \$1800 for first year

So how are we “winning”



2008

- 4,745 unique students
- 9,495 courses taken
- 32% Matriculation as New Freshman Student

2016

- 9,258 unique students
- 18,201 courses taken
- 44% Matriculation as New Freshman Student

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
